He encourages the merchant and gives his ideas that make him rich very soon. After leaving the crystal shop, Santiago joins a caravan that was going to Egypt by crossing the Sahara Desert. Santiago meets an Englishman who was trying hard to become an alchemist and was studying for that. During the journey, Santiago has much discussion with the Englishman and learns many things from him. He learns about a stone called the Emerald Tablet on which the secret of alchemy is written. The Master Work, that is an ultimate creation of the alchemy, is made from the Philosophers Stone. This stone can turn lead into gold. Another master work is a liquid called the Elixir of Life that can cure all ills. Santiago also learns that the

Englishman is traveling to a place called Al-Fayoum, the Saharan oasis, where a powerful, 200-year-old alchemist resides. The Englishman wanted to know many secrets from the alchemist.

Santiago joins the caravan. The caravan had to stay in Al-Fayoum. They wanted to avoid the violent tribal wars taking place in the desert. During the stay, Santiago falls in love with a girl Fatima, who lives at the oasis. Santiago experiences some strange omens that indicate him about an attack on the historically neutral oasis. He informs the tribals about this omen and Al-Fayoum successfully defends itself against the attack. This news of Santiago's vision reaches the alchemist and he invites Santiago on a trip into the desert. During the trip, the alchemist teaches Santiago about the importance of listening to his heart and pursuing his Personal Legend. The alchemist advises Santiago to leave Fatima and the caravan and finish his journey to the pyramids.

The alchemist and Santiago continue their journey through the desert. During the journey, the alchemist shares much of his knowledge and wisdom about the Soul of the World. But unfortunately, when they reach very near to the pyramids, a tribe of Arab soldiers captures them. The alchemist travels with Santiago for so many days. When they reach Coptic monastery, several hours from the pyramids, the alchemist shows his ability of turning lead into gold by using the Philosopher's Stone. After reaching the destination, Santiago starts digging for the treasure at the foot of the pyramids. Suddenly, two men arrive there and beat him but let him live after he tells them about his dream vision. But before they leave, one of the men explains the futility of dreams. The man gives the example of his own dream that talks about a treasure buried in an abandoned church under a sycamore tree in Spain. After listening the man's dream, Santiago realizes that the church is the same one in which he had his original dream. He finally understands where his treasure is. Santiago leaves the pyramids and returns to Spain and finds a chest of jewels and gold buried under the tree. After discovering the treasure, he plans to return to Al-Fayoum, where he will reunite with Fatima.

The Alchemist has didactic approach that teaches some powerful lessons. These lessons are applicable to the life of every human being. Firstly, it teaches the lesson that fears is the biggest obstacle in our way than the obstacle itself. "Tell your heart that the fear of suffering is worse than the suffering itself and that no heart has ever suffered when it goes in search of its dreams, because every second of the search is a second's encounter with God and with eternity." He says that if we want to achieve something big, we need to enter into an unknown region that may be scary. But we should take risk as it comes with a great reward. We should not have the fear of failure because it is the only thing that makes a dream impossible to achieve.

We learn that we should be true and honest to whatever we do. Truth cannot be denied or defeated. It stands firm in any situation. If you are not true, you would not get anything in return. "If what one finds is made of pure matter, it will never spoil. And one can always come back. If what you had found was only a moment of light, like the explosion of a star, you would find nothing on your return" (Coelho). One should find something new and good each day. Life becomes stagnant, mundane, and monotonous if we don't look at it differently. But these changes depend on what we choose to see each new day. The novel makes us realize that the things that seem simplest in our life, are the most extraordinary things.
